

# Kimisarazu Crematorium

Kimisarazu Crematorium is a crematorium for joint use by the four cities of Kisarazu, Kimitsu, Futtsu, and Sodegaura. Kazusa Magokoro Service Co., Ltd. manages and operates the facility as its designated manager.

## Usage Guide

### ◆ Usage guide

- Opening hours: 8:30 a.m. to 5:15 p.m.
- Closed: on 'Tomobiki' days and from January 1 to 3
- Usage fees of Kimisarazu Crematorium (hereinafter referred to as the "Crematorium")
  - Please pay the fee at the counter of the Crematorium.
  - Please pay the fee in cash on the first day of use.

(\*1) "Residents within the area" are those who fall under one of the following categories:

- Those whose address at the time of death was in Kisarazu, Kimitsu, Futtsu or Sodegaura.
- The deceased whose father or mother has an address in Kisarazu, Kimitsu, Futtsu or Sodegaura.
- A person who has lost a part of his/her body who has an address in Kisarazu, Kimitsu, Futtsu or Sodegaura.

(\*2) "Residents outside the area" are those who are not "residents within the area."

- An application for permission to use the crematory is required when using the Crematorium. The permit is issued at the reception desk of the Crematorium.
- At the time of cremation, in addition to the crematory usage permit, a cremation permit, a cremation permit for a dead fetus, or a cremation permit for reburial is also required. Please bring the required permits without fail.
- Number of cremations: Up to 25 per day
- Cremations reception hours: 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- Reception desk is open 20 minutes prior to the reserved cremation time. If you arrive before this time, you may be asked to wait in the parking lot.
- One waiting room per bereaved family group is available (36 persons/room).
- The special farewell room is for bidding final farewells such as chokuso (cremation without funerals) and cannot be used for wakes or the like. If the usage time includes fractions of less than one hour, the time will be rounded up to one hour.
- Use of the mortuary for 24 hours is counted as one day, and use for less than 24 hours will be rounded up to one day.

### ◆ Acceptable sizes of coffins

- No more than 65 cm deep, 80 cm wide and 230 cm long.

### ◆ Reservations for use (ID registered service providers)

- Please refer to the usage guide for funeral service providers.

### ◆ Reservations for use (individuals and non-ID registered service providers)

- Advance reservations are necessary for the use of the Crematorium. Reservations for use on the same day or the following day cannot be accepted regardless of the purpose of use.
- Please check the availability of cremation reservations, farewell rooms and mortuary rooms on the Kimisarazu Crematorium website.
  - ※ If you cannot check the availability on the website, please call the Crematorium.
- When making a tentative reservation, please provide us with the name, date of birth, address, date and time of death, and cause of death of the deceased, as well as the applicant's name, relationship to the deceased, address and telephone number.
- After making a tentative reservation, the applicant must submit a notification of death to the municipal office, receive the necessary documents, and apply for a reservation by submitting the crematory reservation application form and necessary documents to the reception desk of the Crematorium, or by sending these documents by fax by 3:00 p.m. two days prior to the date of use. The reservation application form can be downloaded from the Crematorium website. If you cannot download or print the form, you will need to come to the Crematorium to complete the necessary procedures.

### ◆ Cremation reception

- On the day of cremation, the cremation reception desk is open 20 minutes prior to the reserved cremation time.
- The maximum time for burning incense and bidding farewell in the farewell room is 15 minutes. If you need more time to bid farewell, please apply to use the special farewell room (a fee is required) at the time of reservation. Please note that you cannot apply to use the special farewell room on the same day of use.

◆Special farewell room reception and notes on its use

1. The special farewell room can only be used by those who have reserved it in advance for the day of a cremation held during the one-hour time slots beginning at 11:00, 12:00, 14:00, or 15:00.
2. The special farewell room is open one-and-a-half hours prior to the reserved cremation time.
3. Coffining is not possible inside the Crematorium. Please finish coffining before coming to the Crematorium.
4. The special farewell room can be used for up to one hour, including preparation and cleanup time.
5. The special farewell room can accommodate up to 15 people. Only one room is rented per bereaved family group.

◆Reception of the mortuary and notes on its use

1. Entry of the body into the mortuary is from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
2. Encoffining is not possible inside the Crematorium. Please complete this process before coming to the Crematorium.
3. The fee for the use of the mortuary will be calculated based on the time the body enters the mortuary. Please note that the fee is not determined at the time of reservation.
4. If family members or relatives wish to be present at the time the coffin enters the mortuary, please make sure that they are all present before the time of entry.
5. As a general rule, the funeral service provider is responsible for bringing the coffin into the mortuary. Ceremonies cannot be performed inside the mortuary. It is possible to see the deceased and burn incense.

◆Restrictions on burial accessories

The following burial accessories (items treasured by the deceased) should not be placed in the coffin at the time of the funeral, because their combustion may lead to the release of hazardous materials, malfunction of the cremation furnace, or damage or discoloration of the cremated remains due to the prolonged cremation time.

Item	Example
Vinyl products Plastic products	Bag, shoes, golf balls, dolls, etc.
Synthetic fiber products	Clothes, bedclothes, stuffed toys
Carbon products	golf clubs, fishing rods, rackets, etc.
Styrofoam products	Pillows, cushioning packing, etc.
Glass products	Spectacles, bottles, plates and utensils, mirrors, etc.
Metal Precious metal items	Cellphones, music players, Buddhist statues, jewelry, gold, platinum, etc.
Books Paper products	Thick items such as dictionaries albums and the like, and large volumes of sutra books
Fruit	Watermelons, melons and other fruits
Potentially explosive items	Beverage cans, spray cans, lighters, batteries, etc.
Refrigerants/cooling agents	Dry ice, etc.

Other: Items that are hazardous or may generate toxic substances upon combustion.

\*Pacemakers and other medical devices inside the body might explode during cremation, so if applicable please be sure to notify the Crematorium at the time of reservation.


Parking lots

◆Parking lot No. 1 (northwest of the Crematorium)

- (1) 22 spaces for standard-sized cars
- (2) 10 spaces for minibuses
- (3) Multipurpose parking lot in the central rotary  
4 spaces for cars for physically disabled persons  
6 multi-purpose spaces (including 2 spaces with charging stations for electric vehicles)

◆Parking lot No. 2 (east of the Crematorium)


- (4) 60 spaces for standard-sized cars
- ※Parking lot No. 2 will become available after the demolition of the former crematorium and the completion of the environmental green space construction.
